While speaking during confrontations on the pitch, a behavior officials believe can obstruct interpretation of verbal exchanges and potentially conceal abusive or discriminatory language, FIFA confirmed that the rule will be in effect specifically for the FIFA World Cup 2026 tournament.

While remaining optional for other competitions, such as domestic leagues and continental championships, meaning governing bodies like the Premier League or UEFA tournaments may choose whether or not to adopt it, and in practice, the enforcement will remain highly discretionary.

With referees instructed to evaluate context, tone, body language, and surrounding circumstances before deciding whether a sending-off is warranted, rather than applying the sanction automatically, reflecting a broader effort to balance player expression with transparency and accountability in high-pressure moments of the game.

The decision comes amid ongoing concerns about respect and conduct in elite football, where heated exchanges between players often escalate into accusations of misconduct, and the issue gained renewed attention earlier in the season during a Champions League encounter involving Gianluca Prestianni of SL Benfica.

And Vinícius Júnior of Real Madrid CF, when Prestianni was seen covering his mouth during a confrontation, leading to initial speculation of racist abuse and a provisional suspension, before a subsequent investigation by UEFA reclassified the misconduct as homophobic behavior.

And imposed a multi-match suspension with additional games suspended conditionally, highlighting how quickly on-field interactions can escalate into disciplinary cases that require detailed post-match review. And supporters of the change argue that discouraging players from hiding their mouths could reduce ambiguity in investigations and help match officials more accurately assess incidents of alleged abuse, dissent, or provocation, while critics caution that such a rule could introduce subjective enforcement challenges.

Their mouth will result in punishment, and that sanctions would likely be reserved for cases where the action is clearly linked to dissent, abuse, or obstruction of officiating processes rather than routine communication, a nuance that officials believe is essential to prevent over-penalization in high-stakes matches.



The broader context for this development is FIFA's ongoing campaign to address discrimination, abuse, and misconduct in football, issues that have repeatedly drawn criticism from players, clubs, and advocacy groups who argue that existing deterrents are insufficient to prevent harmful behavior on the pitch.

And while this rule alone is not viewed as a comprehensive solution, it is being presented as part of a layered approach to improving respect within the sport, alongside existing protocols such as anti-discrimination messaging, VAR review mechanisms, and stricter post-match disciplinary reviews.
